Same Message, Different Methods

Several of our Alaska Villages have active cases of Covid-19 and are still under mandates and restrictions. This has led to continued use of alternative methods of sharing the Gospel. We have assisted locations with exploring opportunities to continue ministry during this difficult season. Some of our village locations have adequate Internet to deliver Worship Services, however, it's not available in a number of our smaller villages.

The message of the gospel is never-changing but the methods of sharing the gospel are ever-changing.

This complication of limited Internet isolates a segment of our Alaskans from consistent access to worship services. This led us to explore other options such as conference calling for those locations. I'm thankful for the hard work of our pastors as they leverage technology to continue reaching their villages and regions of the state. We are working on long term solutions to ensure that none of our folks are left out. Stay tuned, you will hear more on this.

Facilities & Target Locations Update

The continuation of travel restrictions in each area of the state has forced us to cancel camps and postpone missions trips. We are able to plan a couple of work projects to complete critical work on facilities. Pastor Mark and a team from MCA Bristol Bay are scheduled to travel to Togiak to complete repairs. Regional travel is currently allowed within the Bristol Bay Region.

We have also had to pause our efforts to get ministry teams into our Target Locations.

Our objective is for each village and every person to experience the fullness of life that comes from knowing Jesus Christ. The communities featured here are ones where we currently have opportunities to begin or enhance ministry. Please join us in praying for God's working in these communities.

- Pray to the Lord of the Harvest for divine encounters that bring laborers into His harvest fields.
- Pray for the Spirit of God to be poured out drawing the lost to salvation, and bringing encouragement to workers.
- Pray for divine favor and supernatural wisdom as workers and resources are mobilized into villages across Alaska.

Winch Needed for Camp Agaiutim Nune

With the addition of the sawmill a few years ago, we have started building cabins at the camp. To gather logs we go upriver and collect them from the river's edge, in eddies, and from sand bars. The logs are then tied together in a raft and floated back down to the camp. Once there, they have to be pulled up the bank out of the river. Currently, we have to cut the logs into small sections while floating in the water. Then, with the use of a lot of muscle, while maxing out the weight limit of current equipment, we are able to pull the logs.

We need to purchase a gas-powered winch capable of moving up to 12,000 pounds. This will simplify this process, reduce the manpower

required, and make this task safer by lowering the risk of injury to our workers. Also, this winch will allow us to pull boats for winter storage at the camp and therefore opening up parking space at the church property in Emmonak. The budget for purchase and shipping is \$3,750. Please contact me if you would like to give toward this.

Health Update

We want to bring an update to what I am dealing with in this season and ask for continued partnership in prayer with us. This battle with stage 2 esophageal cancer diagnosis in Terry was unexpected for us but not surprising to God.

I have completed treatment in July and had a re-staging PET scan on August 6th.

Within 20 minutes of arriving home from that appointment, the thoracic surgeon called to let us know the scan shows good news. He said the **cancer has melted away!**

The current plan is for an endoscopy procedure during the week of September 7th to examine my esophagus. Please join me praying that when they look in there, they will find a new esophagus with no tumor or cancer cells.

Even with all of this going on, I feel really good and have been able to continue working. I have felt closer and more anointing on me than ever before. God has sent His warring angels to us on numerous occasions and has spared me from the side effects of treatment. God has been so good to us and we know He is taking care of this. This (Healing from cancer) is only a simple thing for Him.
