Stony River Easter Service

Mary Willis, our Person of Peace and local Tribal leader, invited us to come to the small remote village of Stony River over Easter weekend. As we discussed the details of our trip, I asked Mary how long has it been since they'd had an Easter Service in Stony River. She responded with;



"I'm almost 60 years old and I don't remember ever having an Easter Service during my lifetime." She also added, "it is has been over 20 years since any ministry has been done in my village for the kids."

US Missionaries Pam and Tracy Hodges led services for the kids each day starting on Friday.

We were told that all the kids present at that time came to the services. Praise God! Each child responded to the Gospel Message by Monday.

Easter Sunday morning we held a worship service followed by a potluck and fellowship time Sunday evening. About 75% of the village population was in attendance.

Many responded and were touched by the power of God. We need to continue presenting the Gospel Message to Each Person in Every Village no matter their size. Praise God for the opportunity to minister to these precious folks in Stony River.

Speed the Light

We are so thankful for the Speed the Light grant funds we received. Pastor Ryan Gluth and our Alaska Youth Department raised funds last fall for our Speed the Light grant.

This enabled us to purchase our new outreach trailer in time for our annual outreach at Arctic Man.

Arctic Man Outreach

Each year thousands of people make the trek north of Glennallen to camp in tents and RV's in this wide valley in the Hoodoo Mountains to attend Arctic Man.

We set up our camp, place our lighted cross up, and give out North Pole coffee and snacks.



Then, as we have an opportunity, we simply have conversations with people and let the Holy Spirit guide us. Each year we have amazing, life-changing encounters with folks.

She responded with "No, I noticed your cross and I need prayer." Danean and other team members were able to pray with her to be delivered from addiction.

As soon as Pastor Jeremiah arrived, he started visiting other camps and inviting them over to our camp. Late morning on the second day one of the guys Jeremiah had met came over.

It was obvious to us that he had a rough night at the beer tent the night before. He had an unlaced boot on one foot and a sandal on the other.

He started talking with us as he huddled up next to the fire pit with a cup of coffee. Within a few minutes, the Holy Spirit led our conversation to the point of us being able to pray with him.



After committing his life to Christ, we prayed with him for deliverance. As soon as we finished, with great enthusiasm, he asked "Can I have a hug?"

Then he pulled out a syringe from his pocket and threw it in the fire pit. Glory to God! By His power, God set him free!

This young man went on to tell us that when we set up our camp and hoisted the cross up, his friends said "Great, we need to see if we can move now, church people have set up camp here."



Friends, the symbol of the Cross is powerful. The Holy Spirit convicts people of their sinful lifestyles and draws them to a point of decision.

We are determined to continue attending events like this to represent Christ. I refer to this as "fishing where the fish are."
