Another major project we tackled was repairing the back wall of the parsonage, which had suffered extensive rot. Parts of the wall were so deteriorated that they needed to be completely removed and rebuilt.



This was no small job, but we tore out the damaged sections and installed new boards and siding.



By the time we finished, the wall was solid, weatherproof, and ready to stand strong against the elements.
